Hoosick Falls School District Free and Reduced Lunch Program

There is not a free milk program at Hoosick Falls Central School. If your student receives free or reduced lunch he/she has to pay the full price for extra milk and snack milk.

A new free/reduced application must be filled out each school year. If an application is not on file by October 16th, the student will automatically go to full pay. A free & reduced application may be submitted anytime during the year. If your financial situation changes, please submit a new application to the school. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

SNAP is the new name for the Food Stamp Program. You can now apply for SNAP online, by mail, fax, or in person at your local Department of Social Services or SNAP office.

You may apply for SNAP using the internet if you live in New York State by going to <u>myBenefits.ny.gov</u>. After your application is filed, the local Department of Social Services or SNAP office will review your information, conduct an interview, and determine your household's eligibility for SNAP.

You may also apply by filing an application by mail, fax, or in person at your local Department of Social Services or SNAP office.

Medicaid- A program for New Yorkers who can't afford to pay for medical care. Complete Pregnancy Care- The Prenatal Care Assistance Program (PCAP) offers complete pregnancy care and other health care services to women and teens who live in New York State and who meet certain income guidelines. Temporary Assistance

To find out if you are eligible to receive Temporary Assistance, including help with an emergency, you need to file an application with your county Department of Social. You should identify any emergency needs you may have at this time. If you have an emergency, you will be interviewed and told in writing about the decision on your emergency the same day you apply. For Temporary Assistance, your interview should be within seven working days of your filing an application. You should be told within 30 days of the date you filed your application for Family Assistance is approved or denied; be told within 45 days of the date you filed your application for Safety Net Assistance if your application is approved or denied. You DO NOT have to be eligible for ongoing Temporary Assistance to receive Emergency Assistance.
